Stephanie Spornitz -Trustee Report (via email)

- Welcome Celeste to the Chauvin School.
- 2019/2020 enrollment numbers up slightly from spring projects....congratulations Chauvin you are one of the ones that increased!
- The board has resumed monthly student engagement session with schools during board meeting days. So please to see Chauvin willing to share at the September session.
- The board is reviewing many policies with the amendments being made to the Education Act including the addition of an Audit Committee mandated by the current government.
- Also mandated by the government is the change of our School Division name to remove the word PUBLIC and drop the divisional numbers. There is some concern over the removal of the word Public as it appears that perhaps we are losing the ability to identify ourselves as a Public body when comparing to Separate, Private and Charter Schools. There is much unrest with this decision as it was not what was in the original announcement.
- BTPS will continue to cover the cost of your membership with the AB School Councils Association should you choose to still belong. It is voluntary so please let me know if you would like to be included. It had been paid automatically in past years but this year we would like to hear from schools that would choose to be a member. The ASCA is a well organized group that has influence on the current government as they represent all parents in the province. I will speak further to the importance of your role at another meeting to bring you up to speed on what is happening with this group.
- For any of you that were part of the Community Engagement groups that met last year to discuss the BTPS Strategic plan, we are going to be hosting a followup session later in this school year to discuss the progress thus far and seek further input. It would be great if students were encouraged to attend. Jordyn Gibb attended the planning session I was at and her input was very valuable.
- MLA Garth Rowsell attended the August board meeting and we had discussions about the rural funding model for AB schools, mental health in schools, transportation, and our current list of Capital projects. I look forward to getting to know Mr Rowsell better and speak on behalf of our schools, kids and families.
- the 2018/2019 transportation budget had a small surplus at the end of the year which was paid out to bus contractors totalling \$30,000.
- BTPS is excited about an international student project and hoping to enroll students as soon as there are families willing to host. Please let me know if you have interest in hosting a foreign student for the AB experience for a whole year or even just a semester!
- BTPS has passed a preliminary budget for operating this school year even though the government has yet to announce their budget. I will keep you updated on progress.
- The Director of Inclusive Learning Crystal Tower was nominated and the recipient of the Society of AB Occupational Therapy award for her great work on Mental Health initiatives at BTPS. Only 2 awards are given out in the province each year. A very prestigious award for some great work for our kids!

3. Programs/Projects
 - Pancake Breakfast went over well.
 - Breakfast program we are continuing to put out fruit and healthy options
 - Monthly birthday recognition – announced in the middle of the month, students receive a birthday pencil- this was started last year
 - Terry Fox Run will be held tomorrow as Thursdays weather is supposed to be cold and wet.
 - Orange Shirt Day – Sept 30th, the purpose is to educate people and promote awareness about the Indian residential school system and the impact this system had on Indigenous communities for more than a century in Canada. Blanket Ceremony will be done with grades 5-10 students focusing on our social studies connections.
 - Picture Day – Oct 3rd
 - Swimming Gr ~~4/6~~ - October 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd
 - Awards Ceremony will be Oct 15th at 2:00 p.m. – Who will be presenting the Grade 9 award? The cheque is needed by Oct 9th and the recipient is Amber Duke.
 - Video Conferencing - Receiving Math 30-2
 - Receiving Physics 20
 - Also Dual credit program of Automotive and Carpentry

4. Athletics
 - Volleyball Teams – ~~Junior Boys~~, Junior Girls, and Senior Girls here (5 girls from Edgerton and 6 from Chauvin)
 - Senior Girls practice Tuesdays and Wednesday and have league games Thursdays.
 - Junior Girls practice Monday and Thursdays, game days are Wednesdays.
 - Hosted Junior Girls Tournament Sept 21nd (9:30 a.m.- 5:00 p.m.) our girls won Silver, Edgerton gold

5. PL Days

- PL days will be held on Fridays throughout the year as shown on the Calendar. The next one is Oct 25th.

6. Budget/ BTPS

- Enrollment is same as last year but division policy is a 94% staffing cap. Trying to get more IA time as our number of severs has gone up. Laura Kelley our Inclusive Learning teacher and I are in the process of finalizing what this will look like.
- Name Change for BTPS – we can still be branded it is just affecting the cheques at the school level. *But board is appealing this*
- Provincial Budget is set for October 24th – not expecting good news.
- No more report cards. Parents are to access Parent Portal to see their student's marks and comments. It will be a process to get teachers to enter things as they mark, not saving up to do a lot of entries.
- School Board is continuing to invite students to engage with them around a topic once a month. Schools were to sign up for 5, we had grade 5/6 students participate last Wednesday.

- Learning Support Teams - LST is a BTPS initiative to bring in expertise regularly to help build teacher/school staff instructional capacity in the classroom. The team comprised of individuals with expertise in the areas of behavior, occupational therapy and speech/language pathology as they relate to the education of all students
- Mental Health - Jamie Knight will be here usually on Tuesday afternoons. She is a registered Social Worker. Her position is funded by BTPS
- Family School Liaison Program (FSL) is now Social Emotional Coaches (SEC) – Stacie Bakken will be in our school Thursdays.

9. SRC

- Have been meeting and working on events.

10. Grade 9's have their Party Program day at the Miscordia October 22.
