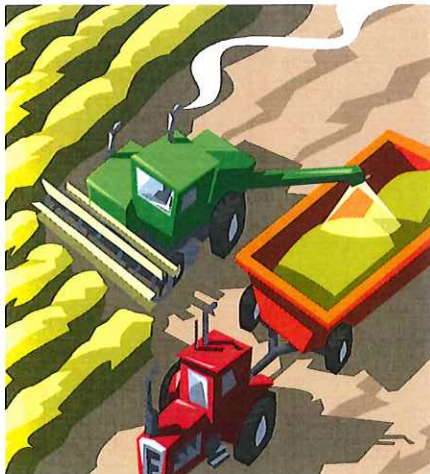

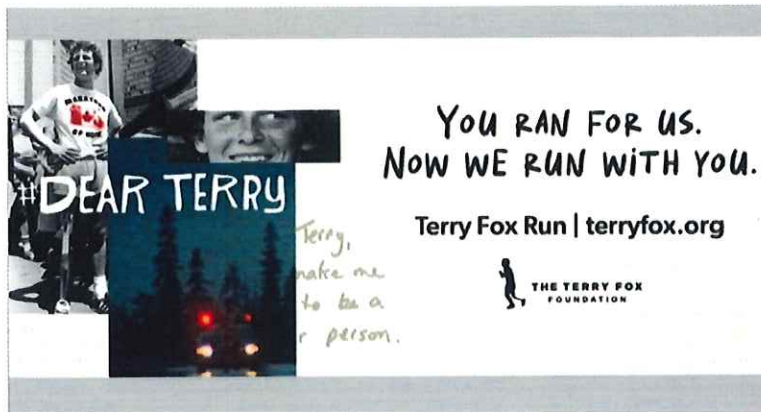

Taken from their families when they are very small and sent to a remote, church-run residential school, Kenny, Lucy, Clara, Howie and Maisie are barely out of childhood when they are finally released after years of detention. Alone and without any skills, support or families, the teens find their way to the seedy and foreign world of Downtown Eastside Vancouver, where they cling together, striving to

find a place of safety and belonging in a world that doesn't want them. The paths of the **five** friends cross and crisscross over the decades as they struggle to overcome, or at least forget, the trauma they endured during their years at the Mission. With compassion and insight, **Five Little Indians** chronicles the desperate quest of these residential school survivors to come to terms with their past and ultimately, find a way forward.

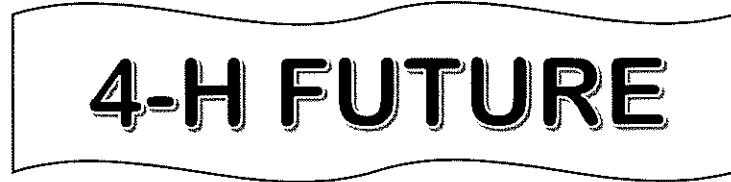

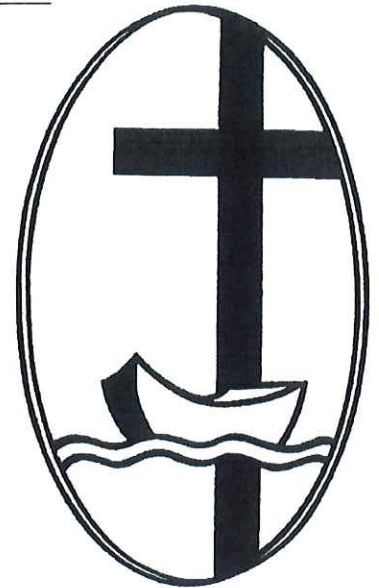

## HOW TO ROW YOUR BOAT

“Row row row your boat gently down the stream  
Merrily merrily merrily merrily life is but a dream.”

This month the kids are back in school, and I’m remembering those wonderful rhymes as children. Back then, my favourite was always the old “Row-Your- Boat” song. Yours too, perhaps? Yeah, there’s probably a few of us still singing “Row-Your- Boat” with the children and grandchildren! This week, however, I was reminded that the rhymes we grew up with are more than just entertainment. Those simple verses actually offer a basic, yet profound wisdom for both children and adults alike; providing a way to help us safely navigate life and the world with all its ups and downs, joys and sorrows. That truth was recently brought to my attention as I watched T.V. and observed a favourite spiritual teacher reciting the “Row-Your-Boat” song, while also unpacking grown-up lessons from something I once thought of as mainly for children. Here’s just some of the grown-up wisdom I discovered from listening to Dr. Wayne Dyer’s “take” on my favourite childhood rhyme:

(1) **ROW ROW ROW YOUR BOAT:** Upon entering the world we each inherited a boat with which to navigate the waters of life. But life only works well when we row our boat with purpose and perseverance. We must avoid the temptation to merely drift through life without a goal or purpose. So put your heart into rowing your boat! Don’t let yourself drift! Yes, to row is to risk, but to drift is to die!

(2) **GENTLY DOWN THE STREAM:** The stream of life is always moving; always flowing, and our boat was designed to move along with it rather than fight against it. Life works best when we seek opportunities to use life’s tides and currents for our advantage. Fighting the current will only wear us out, so be gentle. Go with the flow! Don’t push the river!

(3) **MERRILY MERRILY MERRILY MERRILY:** No one can live without Joy, but we must watch for the opportunities life provides for us to find it. Joy is all around us, above us and within, but it’s usually found only by those humble enough to appreciate and embrace that bigger Joy which upholds and undergirds everything!

(4) **LIFE IS BUT A DREAM:** Life is always a journey towards a destination much too wonderful to ever fully comprehend, but a destination which we, nevertheless, are encouraged to imagine; to dream of, to believe in. Let’s be always willing to dream good dreams – always remembering that dreams become nightmares only if we refuse to put foundations under them. If our dreams are worthy, our foundations will hold. If our foundations are worthy, our dreams can be bold.

It’s amazing what we can learn when we take time to reconsider things we usually take for granted; things we thought no longer important; things we thought didn’t really matter – even if that’s “merely” a children’s rhyme!

## **GOD IS OUR PROVIDER**

In Matthew 6, Jesus' disciples ask Him how they should pray. So Jesus teaches them a very simple prayer that covers the basic areas of life. Jesus' model for prayer orients our hearts toward God and His kingdom work on earth.

Matthew 6: 9- 11

<sup>9</sup>"This, then, is how you should pray:

"Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name,  
<sup>10</sup>your kingdom come,  
your will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
<sup>11</sup>Give us today our daily bread"

What Jesus is showing us in "Give us today our daily bread" is that God wants us to bring everything to Him in prayer – even the small things. God cares about us and our needs.

This prayer also points out that it is God who gives us good things and provides for us. While it may seem like we earn our own basic necessities, it is actually God who gives us our breath and our ability to work and earn a wage. God even created the very food that we eat. Everything we have comes from God. That means we can spend time in prayer thanking Him for what He has given us, and talking to Him about our needs. What's significant is that Jesus doesn't ask for God to provide His needs for tomorrow or next week – he only asks for His needs for today. Our whole life can change in an instant, and things we've stored up for years can be taken away. But Jesus teaches us to depend on God to meet our needs day by day.

*Dependence on God takes trust – but when we trust in Him, we end up living by God's power and provision rather than our own. Take some time today and thank God for what He has given you. Thank Him for taking care of your basic needs each and every day, and ask God to continue to meet your needs each and every day. Consider how you can live with an increasing awareness of God as your provider.*
