Products offered (based on seasonal availability) at our farm stand will include:

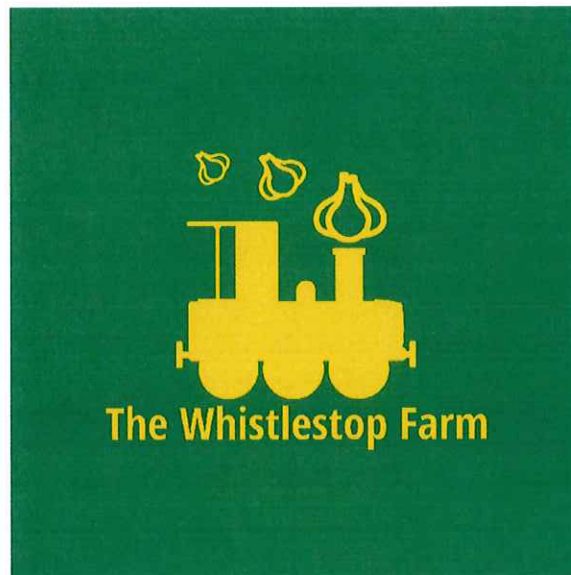

Christians should be the most loving people on the planet. Of all the people on earth, we have been given the ultimate gift from God. We have not only received salvation and eternal life, but we have received the gift of God Himself.

God the Father gave us the breath that we breathe. Jesus brought us to Himself so that we might be saved by His power. The Spirit of God lives within us and empowers us for every good deed. All of these things have been freely given to us.

Having received this amazing love and mercy from God, we ought to love others in the same way. When we love others in the same manner that God loves us, we exhibit the greatest evidence that we are children of God. Jesus said,

“By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.” John 13:35 NIV

Similar to how we can prove counterfeit money by how it looks and feels, we can determine the quality of our own faith by how well we love others.

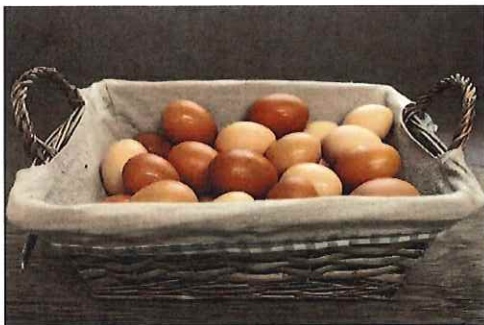

Foundational Learners Assistance Eligibility

Alberta Community and Social Services is committed to ensuring that supports are available to assist learners in completing their high school education. Therefore, Prospect Human Services is contracted to provide Assessment and Case Management services for 16 – 20 year old learners seeking financial supports to attend public high school.

The Prospect Human Service's website is www.ProspectNow.ca which can help with a bit of information on Prospect Human Services including our mission, supporters, programs, and much more! The Youth Assessment Centre (YAC), a division of Prospect who works with the Foundational Learners Assistance Program, does not have a link on the site. This is because our division and funding is accessed through referrals from people like you and is not recommended to the general public.

We run strictly off of the GOA policies based on Foundational Learners Assistance Funding, aimed towards students aged 16–20 in K-12 education programs, who demonstrate financial need and whether or not they meet the following criteria:

- i) Pregnant, or
- ii) Single with a dependent child, or
- iii) Married or in a cohabiting relationship, or
- iv) Student is 18+ and demonstrating financial need, or
- v) There is a breakdown in relationship with the learner's guardians

The student must be registered "Full Time" at an approved educational facility. "Full Time" is defined as being registered and participating in a minimum of 3 classes per semester.

Alberta Works funded learners are expected to attend the program, make acceptable progress, achieve their training goal and facilitate a successful transition to further education or employment. Funding is based on participation/ progression in the classes and consultations with the student as well as the school.

In order to Apply for Foundational Learners Assistance students will need to obtain:

- Their Social Insurance Number
- My Alberta Digital ID - <https://account.alberta.ca/> (this is where they can create an account if they do not already have one)
 - After creating an account the government will send verification in the mail; takes 5-10 days
 - If they do not have the documents required to obtain a MADi, we can work on an Alternate ID Verification process with them
- Banking Information – no form anymore but we do need the Transit, Routing, and Account Number

There are 3 different "Branches" to the Application process: the MADi, the email link from Foundational Learners Assistance, and the Assessment completed by our Coordinators.

Once all 3 have been completed/ received, we can start the Application.

1. Gym Change (shorts or sweatpants and a t-shirt)
2. **Court shoes**
3. Deodorant
4. Lock for gym locker (strongly recommended)

Students must change for gym class. If they wear shorts or sweatpants to school they may be able to wear them in PE class, if they have forgotten their gym change, and it is not happening on a regular basis. **Do not bring skateboarder/Converse shoes (flat bottomed) for PE class.** Girls will be asked to **bring appropriate shorts**, if the ones they have are deemed to be too short. Please keep this in mind when deciding what shorts to bring for PE.
